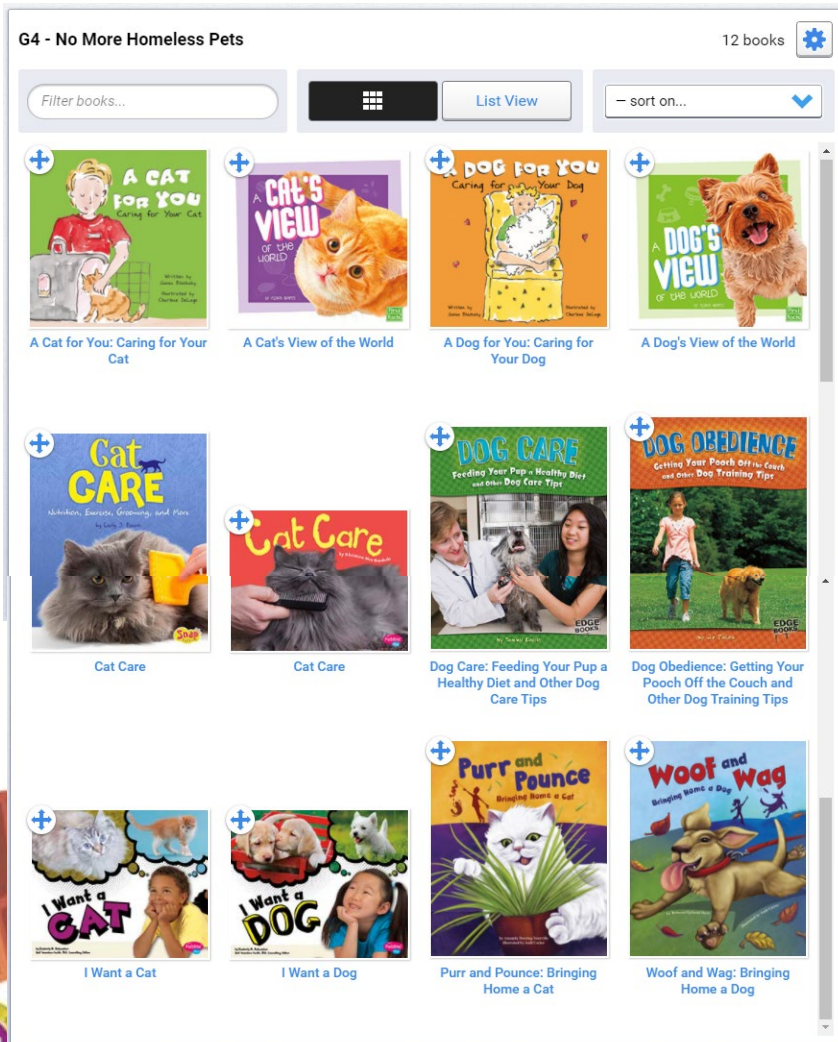


教學支援：G3 (FET) - Animals

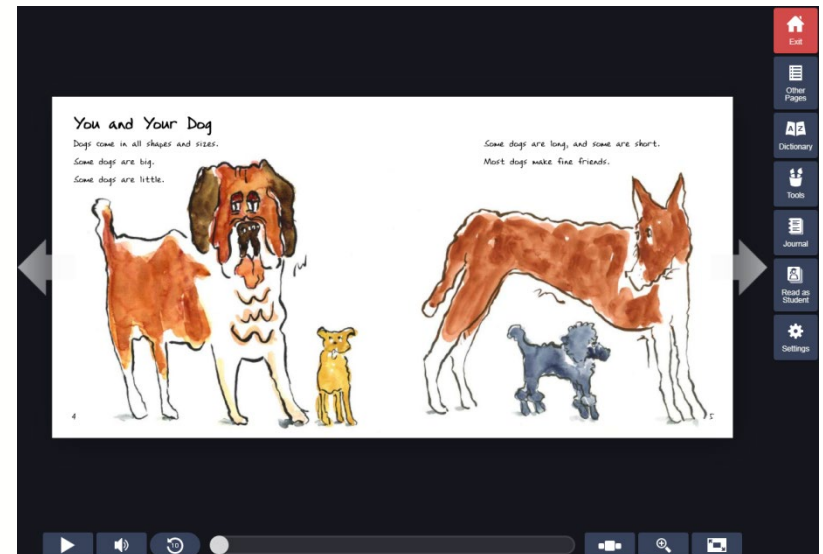
- ▶ 圖書館徵集動物相關書籍，提供教師於課堂使用，幫助學生瞭解不同動物的特色。



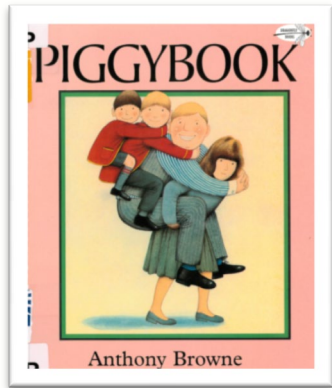
教學支援：G4 (CET) - No More Homeless Pets



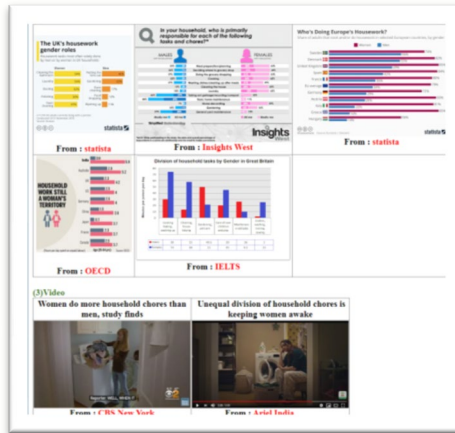

教學支援：G5 (CET) - Gender



- ▶ 圖書館針對性別平等主題，查找切合主題之「**Piggybook**」繪本提供教學使用，透過此繪本，引導學生去發現在日常生活中，對性別的刻板印象。



- ▶ 並在學生數位學習網中整理職業、家庭、專業人士領域中，有關性別刻板印象的主題資源(統計調查圖表、書籍、影片等)，提供學生延伸閱讀使用。



教學支援：G6 (CET) - Drip, Dry

- ▶ 課程以巴勒斯坦、肯亞、印度這三個國家的缺水問題為主線，圖書館協助整理此三個國家的缺水資訊，並建置於學生數位學習網中，作為學生建立心智圖的資料依據。

Fund appeals for donations to help disadvantaged kids

The New Taipei City branch of the Taiwan Fund for Children and Families is looking for donations of NT\$500 or NT\$1,000 to help children from disadvantaged families pay for their stationary or additional cram school fees.

According to the fund's database, more than 50 percent of college students from disadvantaged families have to work part-time while studying, while 30 percent of high school and vocational high school students also have to work part-time to help cover their tuition.

Of that 30 percent, 50 percent have to work part-time to cover family expenses, the fund said.

In terms of education resources, 47 percent of children and teens have no one at home to help with homework, while another 33 percent of families have difficulty providing books for their children, it said.

Citing the Executive Yuan's statistics, the fund said the number of families composed of poor grandparents and grandmothers has increased by 40 percent over the past 10 years.

一年級【借書體驗趣】

- ▶ 課程重點在於讓一年級學生認識圖書館，知道怎麼借還書、知道想借以及適合閱讀的書在哪裡。

二年級【小小愛書人】

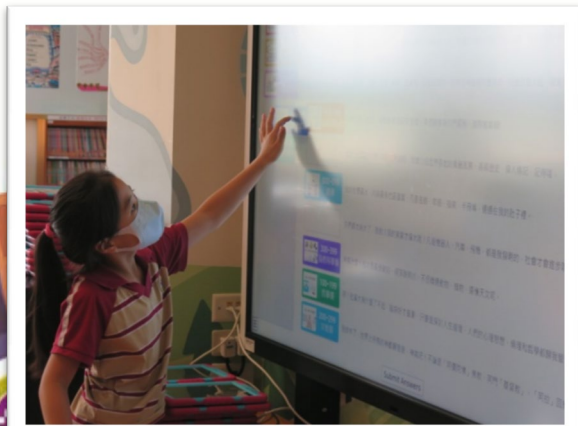
二年級【小小愛書人】

- ▶ 課堂中更讓學生運用所學到的書籍構造知識，完成推薦單，將自己喜愛的書推薦給一年級的學弟妹。



三年級【閱讀小柯南】

- ▶ 搭配社會課「學習如何利用圖書館」單元，認識知識類與小說圖書以及圖書十大分類主題。
- ▶ 並運用Wordwall針對十大分類主題設計互動活動，加深學生對分類主題的印象。



三年級【閱讀小柯南】

- 課程中更教導學生認識圖書館館藏查詢系統，包含查詢想要的書、如何預約書籍以及續借書籍等，並利用i-Pad實際操作與練習。



四年級【閱讀小達人】

- ▶ 四年級課程教導學生認識「參考工具書」，搭配自然課「水生動物」單元，圖書館選擇圖鑑作為實作的工具書種類，課程中學生運用紙本與線上圖鑑回答**Google Quiz**中的問題，使其能真正的利用「參考工具書」查找資料。



五年級【數位閱讀小高手】

- ▶ 五年級課程著重於數位閱讀，介紹圖書館所提供的中英文電子書與電子期刊等，課程中也利用Chromebook實際操作閱讀。



六年級【數位資源利用高手】

- ▶ 六年級課程替學生介紹圖書館的研究型資料庫，包含使用資料庫的原因、連線方法與檢索策略等。



- ▶ 因網際網路的發達，資訊蒐尋途徑已不再侷限於館藏資源，引導學生如何有效的評估、利用網路資源也是課程的主旨之一。
